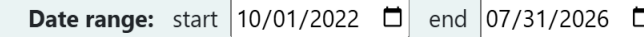
By default, the sentence window is set to 5. This can also be changed.

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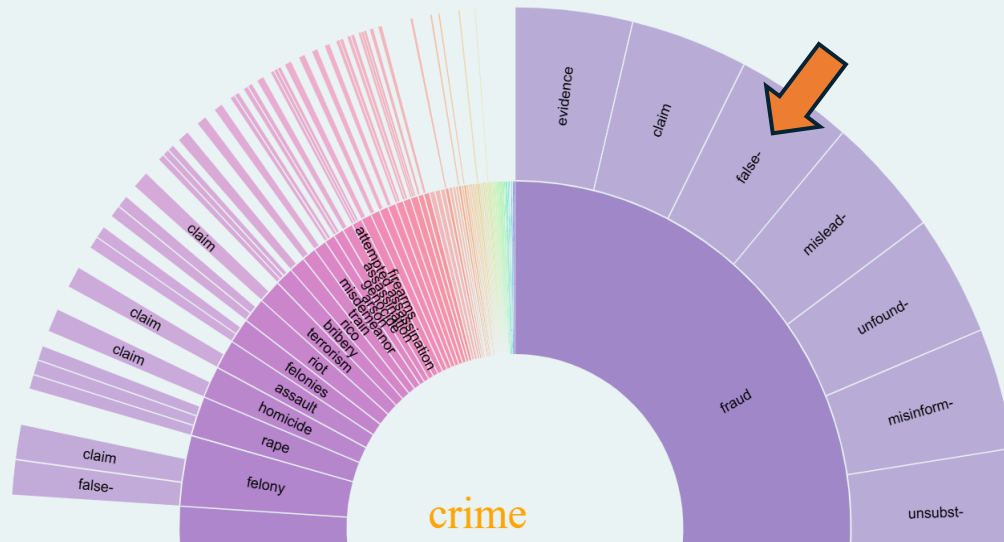
Here we focus on the idea of Crime by clicking the appropriate button.

The sunburst visualization shows Crime surrounded by related terms. The outer ring shows "factcheck" terms often used by Factcheck.org.



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Selecting "false-" outside of "fraud" shows sentences of articles within the date range that Factcheck.org says are false claims about fraud. Currently, the date range is set for all articles of 2025 and 2026.

Note the color coding. Yellow words have to do with the idea and red words pertain to Factcheck's calling out of falsehood. Also, people or groups within the sentence window of these words are also shown in yellow in the lists.

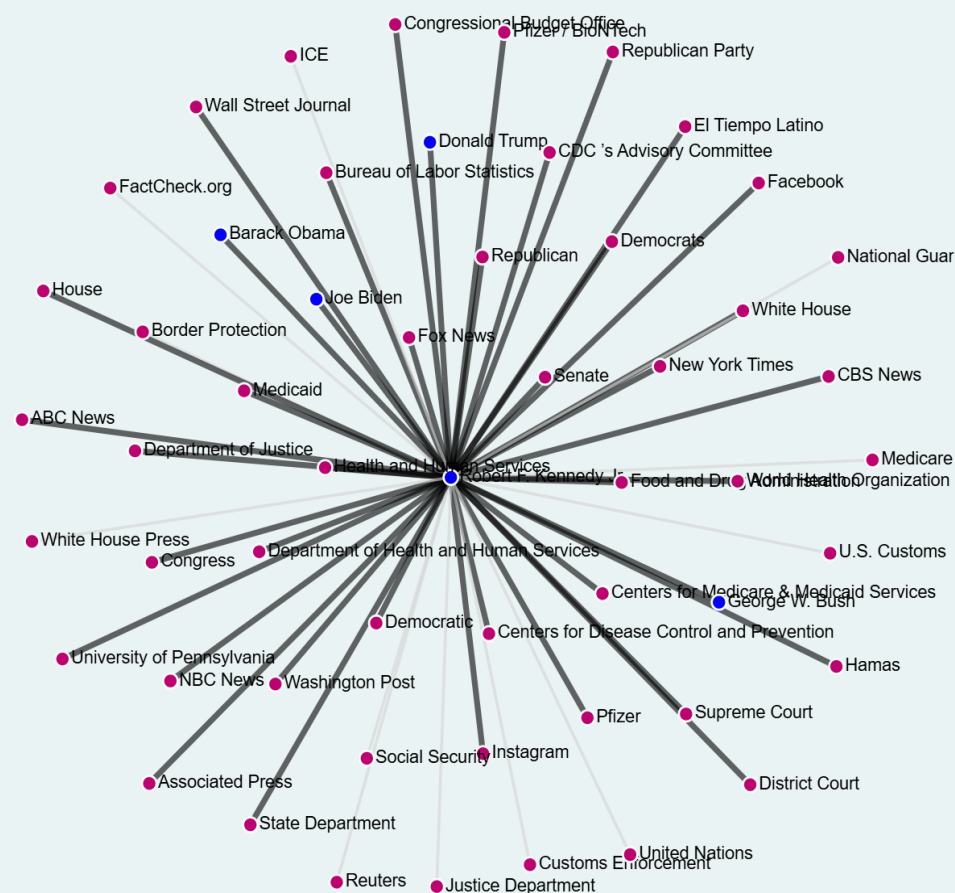

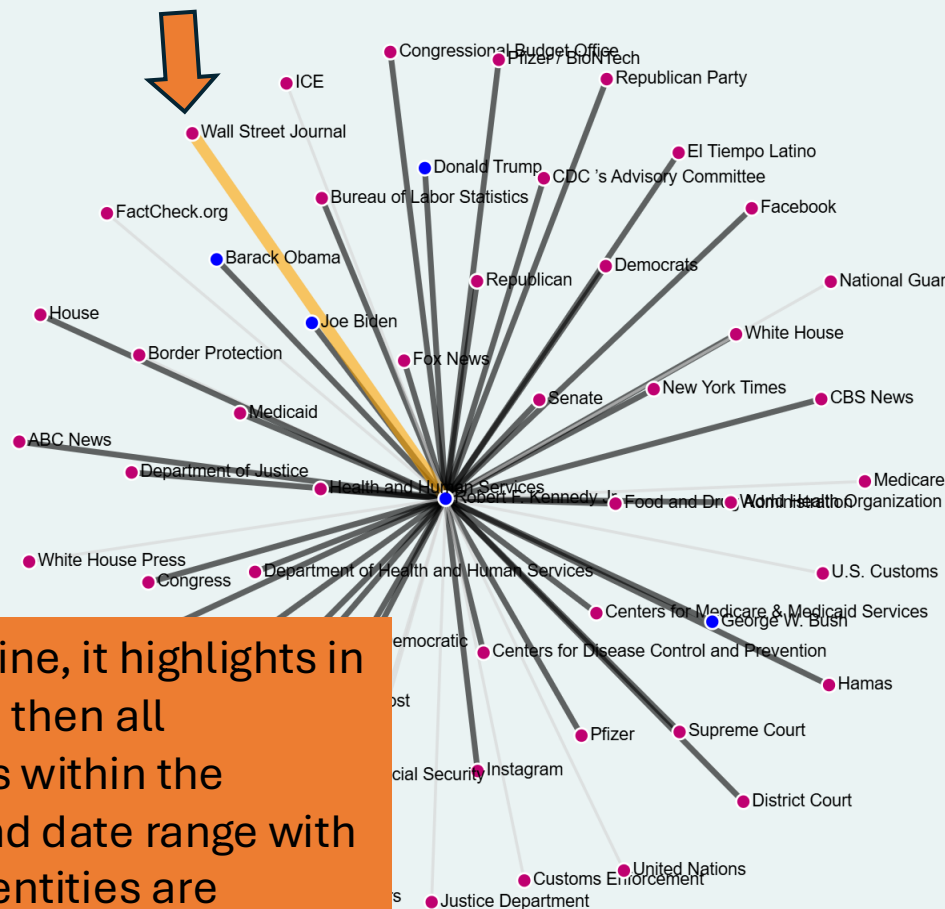

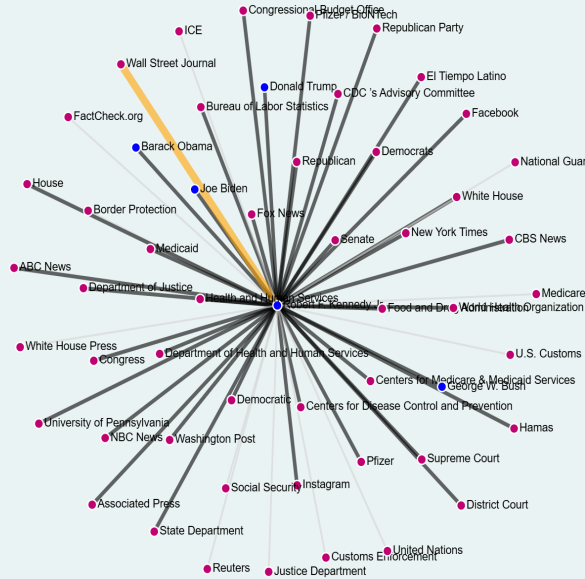

RFK Jr.'s Flawed Justifications for 'Clean Sweep' of CDC Vaccine Advisory Panel

But there's no evidence of problematic conflicts of interest or that the group inadequately scrutinizes vaccines.



Kennedy announced the removals in a June 9 Wall Street Journal commentary. In a press release from the same day, Kennedy said that the move was necessary to restore public trust in vaccines. "A clean sweep is necessary to reestablish public confidence in vaccine science," he said. "The Committee will no longer function as a rubber stamp for industry profit-taking agendas."

The few examples of conflicts of interest that Kennedy provided are either misconstrued or many decades old.

"Allegations of conflicts of interest have no basis in fact," Dr. Tom Frieden, a former CDC director, said in a video posted to X the day after the announcement.
