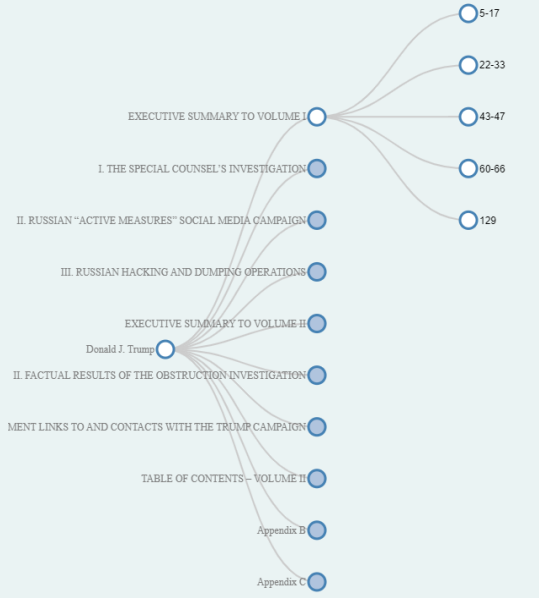

Click a person or organization from a list

A "tree" visualization will appear for that selection, showing the specific chapters where the person appears.



Click on one of the chapter nodes to see nodes of the text fragments in the indictment where the person appears.



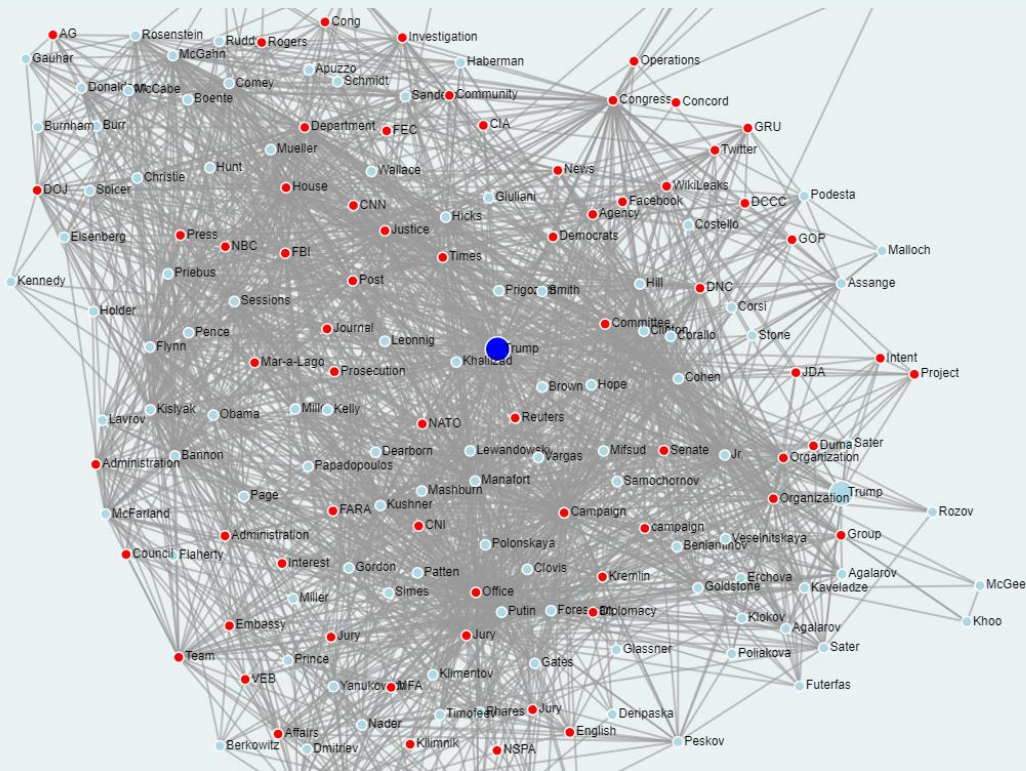
As your mouse hovers over fragment nodes in the tree, the sentences of that fragment with the person appear in a popup.

If you click a node, the text will remain. Hover over the blue fragment number in the text window to show surrounding sentences, or a citation number to see the endnote. Click the popup text window and it will disappear.

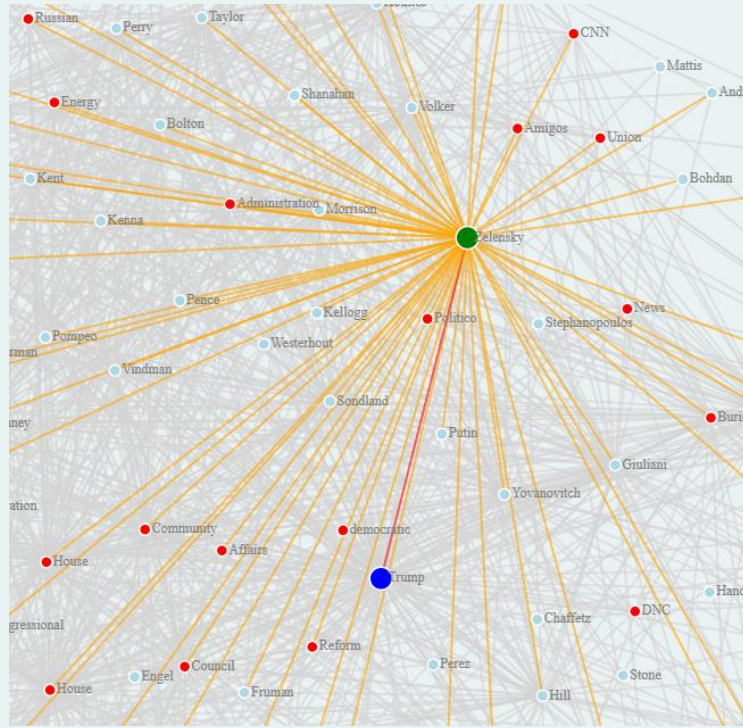
Selecting a chapter from the tree also causes related keywords to be highlighted.

Hover the mouse over an orange word to see the sentences in the chapter containing that person and that word.

This section shows a network of the people and organizations. Blue nodes represent people and red nodes represent organizations. Each link indicates interactions between two actors. Trump is shown in a larger circle with dark blue.

When you click the name of a person or organization, the links connected to that entity are highlighted in yellow. Here we see Vladimir Putin selected from the list and highlighted in green within the interactions network.

The link between the selected entity and Trump is shown in red.

Hovering the mouse over a link shows the sentences depicting the interactions. Here we see connections between Trump and Putin.

Clicking toggles between freeze and unfreeze mode.

II. FACTUAL RESULTS OF THE OBSTRUCTION INVESTIGATION Fragment 2592: P. 6(e) Peskov, who was **Putin's** deputy chief of staff and press secretary.<sup>918</sup> On January 20, 2016, Cohen received an email response from Elena Poliakov. Peskov's personal assistant, and phone records confirm that they then spoke for approximately twenty minutes, during which Cohen described the **Trump Tower Moscow** project and requested assistance in moving the project forward.<sup>919</sup> Cohen recalled briefing candidate **Trump** about the call soon afterwards.<sup>920</sup> Cohen told **Trump** he spoke with a woman he identified as "someone from the Kremlin," and Cohen reported that she was very professional and asked detailed questions about the project.<sup>921</sup> Cohen recalled telling **Trump** he wished the **Trump Organization** had assistants who were as competent as the woman from the Kremlin.<sup>922</sup> Cohen thought his phone call renewed interest in the project.<sup>923</sup> The day after Cohen's call with Poliakov, Sater texted Cohen, asking him to "[c]all me when you have a few minutes to chat . . . It's about **Putin** they called today."

II. FACTUAL RESULTS OF THE OBSTRUCTION INVESTIGATION Fragment 2700: 972 In the final version of the statement, that line was deleted.<sup>973</sup> Cohen thought he was told that it was a decision of the JDA to take out that sentence, and he did not push back on the deletion.<sup>974</sup> Cohen recalled that he told the President's personal counsel that he would not contest a decision of the JDA.<sup>975</sup> Cohen also recalled that in drafting his statement for Congress, he spoke with the President's personal counsel about a different issue that connected candidate **Trump** to Russia: Cohen's efforts to set up a meeting between **Trump** and **Putin** in New York during the 2015 United Nations General Assembly.<sup>976</sup> In September 2015, Cohen had suggested the meeting to **Trump**, who told Cohen to reach out to **Putin's** office about it.<sup>977</sup> Cohen spoke and emailed with a Russian official about a possible meeting, and recalled that **Trump** asked him multiple times for updates on the proposed meeting with **Putin**.<sup>978</sup> When Cohen called the Russian official a second time, she told him it would not follow proper protocol for **Putin** to meet with **Trump**, and Cohen relayed that 969 P-SCO-00009478 (Statement of Michael D. Cohen, Esq. (Apr. 28, 2017)).
